BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

AUGUST 21, 2019

Board Members Present: Donna Gilberto, Lisa DeFilippo, Kim Sapia, John Beatty, Kathy Simmons, Carrie Walters, Gayle Asher, Sarah Stifler Lucas, Del-Bourree Bach, Paul Sellier, Joan Wallace, Emily Reynolds, Jay Berryman, Beverly Schirmeier, Harley Bartlett, Debbi Goodman and Steven Ross, **Board Members Absent**: Serena Bates, Del-Bourree Bach, David Moore, and Lee Ruck. **Staff Present**: Laurie Pavlos, Jocelyn Zallinger, Elsbeth Dowd and Ann Chan

Call to Order: Kathy convened the meeting at 4:03 pm.

<u>Minutes Review and Approval</u>: Kathy asked for a motion to approve the July minutes. Donna made a motion to approve. Gayle seconded the motion. Minutes were approved unanimously.

Executive Director's Report:

Laurie reported that our workshop income would be approximately \$43,000, well over our budgeted amount. Classes did not have a strong response in the spring, so they did not do as well as budgeted, but education as a whole is doing well. The Mid-Summer Festival was very well attended this year. Debbi Goodman was placed at an information table and engaged with guests many of whom donated to the donation bowl and enjoyed picked up informational materials. Six artists rented tents to sell their own merchandise, and this enlivened the whole property. There was probably room for more tents next year if we choose to do this again. We had more than 670 visitors through the gallery. There are three lectures scheduled for the Fall and we need ideas on how to get the word out about these lectures. Steven noted that there are two online newspapers he can get their names to Laurie. Laurie will check with Sue Cornell, our publicity contractor, to see if releases go to these outlets. The Waterworks exhibit was mentioned a couple of times on NPR and that is great free publicity.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: John reported a net of \$15,000 on education. Fundraising has already raised approximately \$16,000 for Palate to Palette and we don't show anything in the budget for them yet. The budget is good if you back those two out. Overall, our finances are healthy. Kathy asked for any other questions for John of which there were none.

<u>Investment Report:</u> Steven reported that there has been a 3.9% rate of return to-date. Since August 8 there has been a small disruption but in general investments are doing well. Steven stated the policy statement for the investment committee was presented last month and he was hoping it would get approved at today's meeting. Kathy noted that the policy basically summarizes what what we have been doing all along. John made a motion to accept the policy document. Sarah seconded. All were in favor.

<u>Gallery Report</u>: Jocelyn reported that since the last meeting we have had the Mid-Summer Festival, Waterworks has been packed up, and Fresh Expressions has been hung. The average price



of the Marine/Waterworks show was \$1,800. The Marine show only sold 12 pieces which was down about \$4000 from last year. Presently, Fresh Expressions has about 184 pieces and 62 pieces

downstairs and 15 at the Old Lyme Country Club as well. This year there was no "Anything Goes" at the Mid-Summer festival, but visitors were able to see the gallery as it should be, and the donation bowl was higher than past years.

APEC Report: Joan noted the committee met last week and finalized the 2020 calendar. Some exhibit names may change. The applications for Elected Artists are being accepted. Jocelyn will pick five Elected Artists to do a screening and then all the elected artists are asked to vote on the remaining applicants. The Zahn Gallery at Middlesex Health Shoreline will have LAA art starting October 24. Jocelyn will pick about 30 paintings from our current Fresh Expressions show. The art market downstairs is being renamed the Brook Gallery. It may not always be art that is not accepted upstairs, but perhaps class instructors will choose art from students taking classes in our studio. Next week the committee will meet to start working in earnest forming plans for the 100th anniversary celebration in 2021. Joan asked for a motion to approve the calendar. Carrie made a motion to accept the calendar. Debbie seconded the motion. All voted in favor of accepting the 2020 calendar.

<u>Development</u>: Elsbeth reported that we are still waiting to hear on the Connecticut Office of the Arts, Supporting Arts Grant. Also, still waiting to hear on the Survey and Planning grant that would be used to improve the building's energy efficiency.

Elsbeth thanked Suisman Shapiro and Hallmark Drive-in for being the Fresh Expressions Sponsors. Jay noted that what a surprising nice and a fun event the opening was. Jocelyn thanked Jay for stopping by to say something as a sponsor at the opening. Elsbeth said she expects to hear very soon, if Chelsea Groton Bank will again sponsor the New England Landscape show. There is no real change in the Annual Fund except is may look like it is a bit less from a reallocation by a donor to Palate to Palette. Elsbeth also reminded everyone that you can now hit "Auto Renew" for online membership renewals.

<u>Building and Grounds</u>: Paul said there was nothing new to report since the last meeting. We are still waiting to hear from the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO). Everything else is current, we are in good shape.

Education and Activities: Laurie asked Lisa if she would like talk about the workshops since she took a couple of our summer workshops. Lisa said that we had people come from as far away as Afghanistan. About 50% of the workshop attendees are from the area and the other 50% are outside of Connecticut. Everyone raved about the area, the accommodations, the staff, and the studio. We are getting a reputation of being a wonderful place to come for workshops. There was a lot of discussion as to how to keep this momentum, going forward, as Laurie noted that Lyme Academy is planning to hold workshops as well in the Spring of 2020. Lisa thought it important to find instructors with a strong social media following. Kathy and others felt it is best to be aggressive



with getting instructors signed up and pushing forward with our program and see how it goes. Emily asked if the Lyme Academy has the infrastructure to pull off holding workshops. Steve stated, that in his 22 years in Old Lyme, the Academy has never been sustainable. Lisa summed

up the discussion by saying that the workshop artists are a small community and that they have very powerful word of mouth.

Palate to Palette: Emily reported P2P is going great so far. The committee is in the final push for sponsor commitments. If you would like to be a Patron level sponsor, let the committee know asap. Emily feels confident that we will reach the \$32,500 mark this year. So far there are 14 restaurants and caterers confirmed with another couple possible. There will be two tents this year. We have partnered with a new package store this year and 30 Mile Brewery will be back again. Ticket sales have increased slightly. There are panels available for artists to pick up to paint donations for the silent auction. Additionally, there will be some new auction items. Paul wondered how many tickets were available for the event. Emily explained that we need to figure out from sponsors how many of their tickets they intend on using. Some use all of them and some use none. Generally, there are approximately 120 tickets available. In closing, Emily reminded everyone artist board members to pick up a panel for the silent auction donation. Kathy reminded everyone to mark their calendars for this great event on October 17th.

Other Business:

Annual Meeting: Kathy wanted to remind everyone that a notice will be going out for the annual meeting on Oct. 23rd at 5:30 pm. It is important for all the board members to be there.

Adjournment of Meeting: Kathy for a motion for adjournment at 4:47. Gayle made a motion for adjournment. Donna seconded, all in favor.

The next meeting is Wednesday Sept. 18, 2019 at 4 pm.

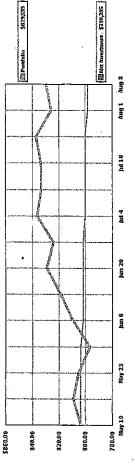

Workshops

- The July workshops ran near capacity
- One workshop had to be canceled due to low enrollment.
- Instructors and the students were very pleased with the facilities and location, and with well-known instructors, this program should work well for years to come.
- **However**, the Lyme Academy of Fine Art is working to find its new niche, and if their present approach is successful we will have to re-think our workshop program.
- One more workshop this year, in October. Enrollment will determine final workshop profits.

Classes

The studio is booked fairly solid this fall. If all the classes run, the income for classes will be slightly below what was budgeted for 2019. This is largely due to several classes being cancelled last spring due to low enrollment.
