

Erasers










small (6" X 6") artist chamois cloth

Brushes

Heinz Jordan 950 White Taklon Flat Wash Brush or similar flat brushes






Substrate/surfaces

Cold press illustration board



Grafix Dura-Lar 9x12 Matte Film



Miscellaneous

Blower

· for removing dust and easer debris



Sketch pencil sand board

· for sharpening pencils and creating carbon dust



Burnishing tool

· for transferring drawings



Small containers

· to store carbon dust



Utility knife

· for sharpening pencils and cutting eraser sticks



Small seal-able plastic bag

· to store dusty sand board






Large sheets of cheap newsprint or similar inexpensive paper



cheap bond printer paper, a few sheets
• to wipe brushes and keep working surface clean



Optional materials & supplies

Artist glove

· to keep drawing surface clean



X-acto knife

· to cut masking film



· to keep unused areas of drawing surface clean



Workable Fixative

· to protect drawing from smudging



Dusting brush

· for keeping drawing surface clean



Transfer paper

• for transferring sketch onto drawing surfaces

Drawing set

· economical option if you don't already have these items
